Minutes from the July 28, 2011 **Lioness BOD Meeting**

Attending were Lioness board members Mary Altman, Pat Berry, Mary Dee, Carol Greeney, Marge Howard, Carol Lee, Zoila Ortega, Maureen Otero, Nora Simpson, Emily Slunt, Beth Sundberg, Ann Walker, Christine Wyant, and Barbara York.

First Vice President Carol Lee introduced LOW resident Skip Poole of CruiseOne, who presented a proposal for an eight-day fund-raising cruise that would depart May 31, 2012, from Baltimore and include ports of call in Bermuda and New England. Bus transportation would be provided from the clubhouse parking lot to the ship. Mr. Poole stated that he had conducted three cruises for the LOW Lions Club, which raised approximately \$16,000. Following his presentation and a question and answer period, Mr. Poole departed, and the board discussed the merits of this undertaking. First Vice President Carol Lee reported that she had done a price comparison between Mr. Poole's agency and Travel Leaders in Fredericksburg, and found that the most advantageous trip with respect to passenger cost and monetary benefit to the club, would be through CruiseOne. After reviewing the proposal, IT WAS MOVED BY Ann Walker and DULY SECONDED BY Carol Greeney to proceed with the fund-raiser proposed by CruiseOne. MOTION CARRIED.

Minutes from the June 23, 2011, meeting had been previously distributed, and the board accepted them as written.

The Treasurer's report was accepted and filed for audit.

President's Report – Zoila Ortega

- The procedure for handling birthday announcements at our dinner meetings was discussed and it was decided that this would be conducted as in the past, with each honoree's name being announced by the club president or her elected representative.
- Consideration was given to a policy with respect to guest speakers, and after a brief discussion, IT WAS MOVED by Beth Sundberg and DULY SECONDED by Marge Howard that the following restriction be observed for future dinner speakers: "No club member should be a featured speaker if such an occasion would result in that member's profiting from the sale of goods and/or services." **MOTION CAR-**RIED.

Furthermore, Christine Wyant suggested that we sell advertising space in future membership handbooks for Lionesses to promote their products and services, and President Zoila Ortega asked her to pursue this excellent concept further.

With respect to our fund-raising luncheon and fashion show in May, President Zoila Ortega reported that the Executive Director of Sheltering Arms will be attending our August dinner meeting to express

This is being investigated by the Book Sale co-chairs.

Tamer's Report - Carol Greeney

 There were ten no-shows at the July meeting; Tamer Carol Greeney will coordinate with the treasurers with respect to collecting these dinner fee obligations.

Tail Twister's Report - Nora Simpson

 Tail Twister Nora Simpson said that she would see that the treasurers receive the collected finds in a timely manner. She also stated that she had developed a good working relationship with Pittman Florist and finds them most accommodating.
