Did you Know — Karin Goetz

Karin (pronounced car-in) was born in Germany and spent her early childhood in the beautiful Rhine River area. Prior to Karin's birth, her father served on the Russian front in World War II. Weighing 180 lbs. when he left, her mother barely recognized him upon his return as he weighed only 97 lbs. Years later he decided to follow his dream and become a police officer. The family moved to Idar-Oberstein, a charming town known for its precious stones and diamond factories. They spent 3 happy years there, when unexpectedly at the age of 47, her father died of heart failure. Her mother, having struggled through 2 World Wars, was determined to take care of Karin who was only 8 and her older brother especially when it came to their education. Karin was accepted into the gymnasium at age 10 due to her excellent grades. Although money was a factor, her mom somehow made it happen. At the gymnasium Karin began her studies in foreign language with emphasis on English.

Grieving the loss of her father, Karin's only comfort was her faith in God. She became very involved in her church and choir performing for children in orphanages as well as the elderly. During one Christmas season when she was only 9, she was chosen to sing a solo, "Silent Night." During her performance, she began to cry thinking of the orphan children before her who had lost both parents. This realization brought her out of her own grief. She became aware that God had always had his hand on her.

An American friend of the family stationed in Germany dropped by one day to say hello and learned that Karin's father had passed away. This timely visit eventually led to marriage between this caring friend and her mother and Karin was adopted. Her journey to America began by military ship across the Atlantic followed by a long drive across the U.S. to Fort Lewis Army base in Washington State. Karin was 11 by then and eager to become an "All American Girl." She was determined to lose her German accent and loved the American school system because it wasn't as intense and petrifying as the gymnasium had been for her in Germany. She was taken by the hospital lity of the Americans and the freedoms we all enjoy. With her stepfather's tour lasting only 18 months and his love of Germany, they returned to the southwestern portion of Germany near the French border. Karin graduated there and got her first secretarial bookkeeping job on the military base nearby.

It was there that Karin met the handsome Captain Bill Goetz, an Executive Officer on base. She did some typing for him when other secretaries were unavailable and he took her to lunch to return the favor. Evidentially Karin's mother fell in love with the dashing captain first when he came to dinner. She thought so highly of him that she gave her blessing to their marriage in 1969 and move to the U.S. to Westchester County, NY where their son, Christopher was born.

With a move in between to Connecticut, they settled in Burke, VA in 1984 where they lived for 20 years. Discovering LOW, Karin and Bill decided this was the place where they would retire and grow old together. They just celebrated their 45th anniversary with a cruise to Alaska with their entire family including son Christopher and his wife, Amy, her parents and their 2 grandchildren, Ben 12 and Emily 8. They have become close friends with Amy's parents having met at their children's college graduation. There is no competition between families as they celebrate all family holidays together.

Karin joined Lioness in 2010. She served as 3rd vice-president during the 2013-14 Lioness year. As such, she was the chairperson for the July 5th parade. Our LOW community is more aware today of the all the ways 'we serve' because of the incredible signs Karin provided for all the Lioness marchers in the parade!
