Carol was born in Parkersburg, West Virginia. Her father was a meat cutter in a grocery while her mother worked in the viscose rayon manufacturing industry. Carol was the oldest of 6 daughters all born within 7 years of each other. She was affectionately known as "big bossy sister." Carol was very active in high school and especially enjoyed writing. Her activities included working as editor on the school newspaper and the year book staff at Parkersburg High. It did not take long before Carol caught the eye of John Edwin Stanley while attending church. John had graduated from Parkersburg previously and had spent a year attending business school. They were married in the fall of 1947 and entered Marshall University. Carol went to school part time while working as a secretary for Wilson Meat Company. With her ability to write, John somehow talked her into writing ALL of his papers. He would give her a list of pertinent information and she would do the rest. Upon "their" graduation, John went into the Marine Corps and after graduating from Officers Candidate School, he was stationed at Quantico. While there, they had 2 children a daughter, Cathryn and a son, David exactly 11 months later.

Following his commitment to the USMC, the decision was made to attend graduate school at Ohio State University where they lived on campus. John again talked her into writing All of his papers. John gave her a list of pertinent information and she did the rest. While in Cleveland some 5 years later, they had another son, Philip and a daughter, Susan.

Following graduation, John accepted an offer for employment from Ernst and Ernst, a CPA firm in Cleveland. He worked for them for 30 years before retiring. As a family they enjoyed spending summers at their cottage near Akron on Lake Berlin. The children went onto school and pursued their own careers. Loving to be near water plus a growing dislike for the Ohio winters, John and Carol decided to acquire property on Longboat Key, Florida on the west coast, south of Tampa. While there, Carol became quite active in team tennis. She always seemed to remain busy with various activities. At one point she joined a courtier sewing course and the teachers incorporated the latest designs from Europe. John and Carol normally spent the months from September to May in Florida and in due course sold their big home in Cleveland and went directly to the Lake Berlin cabin during off season.

Eventually they made their way to Lake of the Woods at the urging of their daughters who both live in Fairfax. Initially they were located on the small lake but then moved to a larger home on the big lake. It became increasingly apparent that John was not well and unfortunately he passed away in 2010.

Carol's children are quite accomplished. Her eldest daughter teaches visually handicapped children and the youngest daughter is an attorney as are both their spouses. Her oldest son was a bank president before retiring and her youngest son is an attorney and CPA in Florida. She has seven grand children; all have busy lives and are completing their educations. Carol is an active member of Lake of the Woods Church and has been a member of LOW Lioness since 2011.
