Dr. Travis Stoner graduated from Shenandoah University with a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology in 2002 and a Doctor of Physical Therapy in 2005. After graduating, Dr. Stoner worked at Winchester Rehabilitation Center gaining experience in neurological, vestibular, and total joint replacement rehabilitation as well as serving as the Director of their Aquatic Physical Therapy program. Dr. Stoner moved to Northern Virginia in July 2009 with an interest in expanding into orthopedics and sports injuries. In addition to his practice experience, he has also served as an Assistant Professor at Shenandoah University's Division of Physical Therapy and has performed physical screening for officer candidates at Quantico Marine Base. Dr. Stoner is a Faculty member for Maitland Australian Physiotherapy Seminars teaching continuing education courses across the country.



Growing up in England, Lynne had a happy childhood filled with boarding school friends at St. Theresa's Convent in Effingham, Surrey (south of London). Bonds formed at boarding school remain, and she is still in touch with two of her friends from the convent.

Lynne still remembers the first time she saw her adoptive father. He was in his Navy uniform and he was taking Lynne and her mother to dinner. He was soooo handsome

and it was love at first sight for the eight-year old Lynne. After marrying her mother, Charlie Brown (and yes he is a good man just like his Peanuts namesake!) adopted Lynne and they came to the states in 1969.
