Did You Know—Margaret Findell's Childhood Story

For most of us our childhood experiences are far different from Margaret Findell's. Margaret, her mother and grandmother lived in Essex, England, near the channel. Her innocent childhood was forever changed when news came of war with Germany as she was skipping rope.

England's ships and destroyers were sent to nearby ports. Huge barrage balloons were sent airborne in an attempt to protect from low altitude dive bombers targeting the ships in the harbor. But the ports were in chaos. In June 1940 Margaret witnessed the sinking of the HMS Gipsy in nearby Felixstowe with 4000 sailors aboard.

In an effort to save the next generation, all children under the age of 14 were forced to evacuate. So on June 2, Margaret, then only 9, found herself at the train station with many weeping parents and children bound for safe haven in Wales. When they finally arrived, they were quickly examined and put on a bus for their final destination. After a very long day, she and another girl were dropped off in the dark in front of a stranger's home. They didn't know what else to do but knock on the door. Margaret doesn't remember much except they were unhappy. School officials soon moved them to another home where there would be a total of 4 evacuated girls. Margaret remembers no days of celebration, only hard times from this time period.

After a couple of years away from home, Margaret eventually developed impetigo. As there were no doctors available, they tried various remedies to no avail. As her condition worsened, her mother was called to pick her up.

The remainder of the war, she spent with her mother and grandmother in Essex. They endured many German air raids and spent terrifying nights wondering if they would be hit next. With no warning, they would run to hide under a table or if time, to the nearest air raid shelters with their gas masks. People tried to calm each other by singing songs and smoking.

Upon turning 14, she was required to go to work for the war effort and measured food rations. Life was hard growing up, but Margaret believes it made her into a better and stronger person.

A DVD of Margaret's life story made by AARP now exists at the Library of Congress which Margaret considers a great honor.
