Did You Know — Beth Sundberg

During this past year, Beth has entertained and enlightened us with biographies of different Lionesses in order that we can get to know each other better. We have decided that it is time to "turn the tables" and have an opportunity to know Beth better. We are very fortunate that Beth has volunteered to continue to do the monthly biographies during the coming year. Connie LeMay

Beth was born in Chicago at the onset of World War II. Her brother, Phil, was 2 years older and they were very close throughout their childhood usually coming home battered and bruised after a full day of play. Beth's grandfather founded the Northern Illinois College of Optometry and later her father assumed the presidency. It was here that her mother and father met. When Beth was 8 years old, Melissa was born and the family was complete. In 1952, the family left Chicago and moved to Greensboro, NC where her **MORE**See pg. 7

Father began a practice of optometry. During her high school years Beth and her close friends frequently climbed nearby mountains. Most of these friends were also involved in the orchestra at school and All-State where she played viola for a number of years.

In high school, Beth made a decision that affected the rest of her life. She wanted God to be part of her life asking for his guidance in all her decisions. He has been faithful to her every step of the way since – through the good times and the difficult ones.

Beth attended Taylor University where she obtained a B.A. degree in Speech and Sociology. During her summers she attended Young Life's Frontier Ranch in Colorado where she counseled high school girls from all over the country. After graduating, she joined the Young Life staff and ended up in the Chicago suburbs. Beth met her husband to be, Bruce, in Chicago and they married in December, 1964. Soon after, Bruce was asked to begin Young Life in the St. Louis area. Beth became a caseworker in St. Louis County with a focus on Aid to Dependent Children. Their daughters, Ashley and Sara were born in St. Louis and they were a very happy contented family of 4. While in St. Louis, Beth was quite active in Jaycee Wives.

In 1972 they were asked to move to the Philippines as Bruce became the Asian Director for Young Life. While on board the ship, Martial Law was declared. In many ways Martial Law worked out to be a blessing because former senate leaders and Supreme Court Justices as well as the leader of the Catholic Church, Cardinal Sin, became increasingly concerned for the youth of the country. Bruce and Beth trained a number of university students and a Young Life work was eventually formed and continues to this day. One of the greatest gifts for Beth during this time, was the Union Church of Manila. Lifelong friends were formed there. Beth was quite active in the Women's Auxiliary, Board of Elders and also taught a bible study for international women.

When they decided that it was time to return to the United States, they moved to Vienna, Virginia. Bruce continued his work with the Fellowship as a consultant working with congressional leaders with a focus on Asia.

In 1982, Beth became the Director of Amicus International Student Exchange. She traveled extensively both in the U.S. and abroad to set up and work with a network of volunteers who recruited students overseas and placed students in host families throughout the U.S. for a high school exchange year. On one occasion Beth asked Bruce to join her on one of her recruiting trips and they "happened" to be in West Berlin when the Wall came down. They participated in welcoming people who were experiencing freedom for the first time.

Having built their home 1997, they moved to LOW and were weekenders until 2001 when Beth retired. They both became active at LOW Church and for a number of years Beth was a mentor to young mothers in MOPS (Mothers of Preschool children). She also enjoyed her work at Brock Road Elementary tutoring a boy and helping him catch up academically. Beth joined the Lioness in 2009 after her house was used for the Holiday House Tour.

Today Beth's greatest joy is spending time with her grandchildren. Her oldest child, Ashley, is going through a difficult divorce so Beth is providing comfort to her grandchildren, as well as trips to Northern Virginia to help daughter Sara who recently underwent brain surgery to remove a tumor resulting from breast cancer.

Beth's motto has always been that it is more blessed to give than to receive and she has lived her life with that thought uppermost in her mind.

Our club has been extremely fortunate to have Beth steering us this past year and we are very grateful for her example of how a strong woman copes with life and also for her leadership.
