Did you Know: Hilda Valenta Seary

Though impossible as it may seem, Hilda Valenta Seary just celebrated her 80th birthday in September, glamorous as ever. She was born in Chadbourn, North Carolina and was the middle of five children. Her father owned farms in North Carolina so summers were spent on one of the farms at her great grand-mother's home. After graduating from high school, she came to Washington, DC to the Patricia Stevens Finishing and Modeling School. As a result she began modeling for newspaper advertisements and department stores around the DC area such as Garfinkels, Woodies, Hecht's, and Saks.

Hilda made her way into the Management Training program for Montgomery Ward's catalog division. At the time there were no retail stores. Her first years with the company were spent traveling around the East coast opening, hiring, and training the staff. Eleven catalog stores were opened in the DC area.

Her first date with Harry Valenta was a Redskins game joining a party including the president of the Norfolk Southern Railroad followed by dinner and dancing at the Mayflower Hotel. Harry was an accountant with the railroad at the time. After marrying Harry in 1955, they settled in the DC area. Two children were born, Susan and Charles, now residing in Virginia with their own families. Hilda eventually was managing several stores in Washington and later transferred to the Retail Personnel division out of Falls Church. This position found her organizing and opening a central phone unit for the catalog business in Wheaton employing 130 clerks for all orders in the DC area. She was the first woman to advance to the Executive level in the company and was promoted to the position of Washington area District Fashion Merchandise Manager, directing all ladies fashions and accessories for Montgomery Ward's 10 stores. She frequently travelled to New York to meet with designers, buyers, and manufacturers in addition to arranging newspapers advertisements and fashion shows in various downtown hotels.

She was involved in the Business and Professional Women's Club in Washington and served as President in 1972-73. She remained active until she retired in 1991.

Hilda joined Lioness in 1978 as one of the charter members of the Oxen Hill club. She was a member at St. Barnabas in Oxen Hill serving on the board and Women's Guild. In 1982, she opened Valenta Properties with her son. This involved buying and remodeling houses for rental or sale.

In '91, she and Harry decided to move to Lake of the Woods at their son's urging. They enjoyed square dancing and she took up painting, and among many other activities, she was an elder at Lake of the Woods Church and now serves on the Flower Guild making arrangements for services. She is a member of the Republican Women's Club, and is still active in Lioness having filled all chairmanship positions and serving on committees.

After Harry's death, she met Tom Seary four years later at Lake Waccmaw in North Carolina. They happened to be at a function together and upon meeting one another, never stopped talking! Another gentleman at the table finally gave up trying to talk with Hilda saying, "Well, I can tell a couple who is courting!" By then, Tom was retired having worked in the Aerospace industry for a number of years in New York. Both had been widowed for 7 years, knew a good thing when they saw it, and were married on July 2, 2006. They are still enjoying life together and love to travel especially to the European countries.
