Minutes from the October 24, 2019 BOD Meeting

Minutes from the September 26, 2019, meeting had been previously distributed, and the board accepted them as written.

The Administrative Budget was presented and accepted for audit.

President's Report – Linda Shnayer

- Jan Lemieux requested Member-at-Large status from November until May, as did Debbie Attiliis from November through January. Both requests were approved.
