Did You Know— Marth Grandy's Story

"Texan through and through". That's how Martha describes herself. She was born and spent her early years in Texas. Her 2 brothers were born first. Announcement of her birth came from her older brother who ran around the neighborhood declaring that he got a baby sister for his birthday! When Martha was only 10 years old, her mother sadly died. Her father's job took them to Hattiesburg, Mississippi where her father met and married Martha's 6th grade teacher. Her step-mother also had 3 children, younger than Martha and her brothers. Martha became the built-in babysitter. Martha returned to her beloved Texas each summer to be with her aunt and uncle. Those were happy times as she was quite close to her mother's sister. Martha's step mother will turn 100 in September.

Though Martha married her first husband while attending the University of Southern MS, she eventually received her college degree. A son, Dan, and daughter, Sherri, were born during this first marriage. She and her husband were married for some years before he passed away soon after retiring from the Army.

Martha continued working at the MITRE Corp while pursuing further studies. Having learned her lesson first time around, she held off marrying her new love, Cork, until she received her master's degree from American University at the age of 48! This opened up a whole new world. Martha was in her element and in time became responsible for educational programs and career management development at Mitre. Under her leadership Mitre Institute was established. This led to business/education partnerships with American University, NOVA, and George Washington University. She frequently was a presenter at her professional conferences throughout the U.S.

After Cork retired, Martha kept on working. Wanting to spend more time with him, she also decided it was time to "retire." However, she quickly found herself teaching speed reading courses on cruise ships where Cork could join her. Passengers were very enthusiastic and soon wanted more than the 30 one hour lectures offered. She and Cork began additional lectures on right/left brain personality styles and characteristics. Their favorite trip was a 52 day voyage to South America around Cape Horn loving every minute of the excursion.

As a couple, Martha and Cork have suffered losses. Cork's daughter was tragically killed in a car accident in 1997 when a truck ran a red light as she was on her way home from having lunch with her husband. And then Martha's dear daughter, Sherri recently passed away in February of this year after years of debilitating complications from diabetes.

Through it all, Martha considers it a privilege to have known her daughter as an adult woman. Martha has a strong faith in the Lord. She believes that something good can happen out of every tragedy.

Lake of the Woods Church has been an important part of Cork and Martha's lives. Both have served the church well in key positions of leadership with pastor and friend, Tom Shafer. Cork and Martha's life has been full in their 30 happy years of marriage with a blended family of 6 children, 15 grandchildren, and 5 great-grandchildren.
