Did You Know — Ellen Bearden

One thing I am convinced more and more is true and that is this: the only way to be truly happy is to make others happy. When you realize that and take advantage of the fact, everything is made perfect. William Carlos Williams of Rutherford, NJ, Pulitzer Prize winning poet, best friend of Ezra Pound and childhood pediatrician of Ellen Kreutzer Bearden.

Ellen and her family moved from Wallington to Rutherford, NJ when she was two. Her father, a banker in NYC, walked to the end of the street and caught a bus into the city for 48 years. Growing up, Ellen fondly remembers family outings to NYC museums and time at the Jersey Shore. She experienced freedom in her teenage years that allowed frequent trips to the city with her friends. Once they skipped school to watch a ticker tape parade for the astronauts. Other times, she had written permission from her mom. After watching a parade on Wall Street, she and her friends would meet her dad who worked nearby for lunch. In school, Ellen was a JV cheer leader, a color guard and was active in intramural sports, mainly volleyball. And there were the high school service clubs with the Nurses Club being the focus. Rutherford was a tight knit community, and with her mom being a school nurse, Ellen was always under threat should she consider misbehaving.



It was almost predestined that Ellen and her twin sister, Lynne, would become nurses and join the ranks of their mom and older sister, June. Brother Dave is an engineer. Ellen and Lynne graduated from nursing school at Jersey Shore Medical Center. Ellen began her nursing career at Hackensack Hospital in surgical intensive care.

During a visit with Lynne and her husband, a member of the Navy stationed in Puerto Rico, Ellen met Bill Bearden, a photo journalist also with the Navy. After getting married, there were a series of 1-year Naval assignments beginning with Puerto Rico, and then Miami where their son Shawn was born in 1972. Remaining in FL, they were then located in Pensacola, a favorite, where Bill completed a program in advertising and Ellen returned to nursing in surgical intensive care. The next assignment took the young Bearden family to Greece. Ellen, Bill and Shawn

took advantage of the historic location. They lived in a regular Greek neighborhood, and Shawn, a toddler, learned to fluently speak the language of the neighbors. Special Services provided sightseeing trips across the country. The following move took them to the Washington, DC area where Ellen worked the surgical floor at Circle Terrace, a small hospital in Alexandria. When Shawn was in second grade the Beardens moved to Woodbridge and Ellen worked for a pediatrician.

After Bill retired from the Navy, the family moved to eastern Prince William County where they had built a house. Ellen returned to school at GMU and earned a degree in upper elementary education while working part time at Circle Terrace. After 22 years in the nursing profession, Ellen began teaching 4th grade in Woodbridge. Opportunity soon knocked with the state of Virginia mandate to have counselors in elementary schools. Ellen was accepted into the program and earned a Master's Degree from Virginia Tech. The new position as counselor allowed her to combine the mental health aspects of her nursing profession and the teaching of her new career. Ellen is proud of the students and parents she was able to touch with the programs she implemented.

Ellen and Bill rented a house at the lake while their new home was built. Ellen devoted 18 years to the teaching profession, retiring in 2004. Both enjoy golfing, and they love to travel. Eight river cruises have taken them throughout Europe, China and Russia. They also retreat to their condo in Ocean City, MD.

Ellen's has 2 step daughters. Rhonda lives in Colorado, and Laurell lives in Vermont. Her son Shawn is a professor of physiology at Idaho State University and is quite an athlete. Check out his website: http://www.scienceofultra.com/about/. Ellen and Bill have 5 grandchildren.
