September Speaker

The September dinner speaker will be Jessica Sarver, STEM Coordinator for Orange County Public Schools (OCPS). She will be speaking about the STEM Bus and other STEM and instructional initiatives. STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. The STEM Bus will create a mobile STEM classroom to help remove the financial, transportation, and material barriers that keep some children from experiencing the hands on, collaborative STEM activities. OCPS STEM has received grant money to complete phase 1 of the STEM Bus build. The STEM Bus will be used during the school year to support classroom STEM instruction with grade level specific activities and teacher professional development, and during the summer provide free STEM outreach that travels to different areas in Orange County. They are currently fundraising to supply the bus with solar power, and Lake of the Woods Lions Club will match up to \$5,000 towards this project.

Jessica grew up in Madison County and received undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Mary Washington and her Administration Certification from James Madison University. She was a teacher for 7 years and an Instructional Coach for 4 years in Madison County, and is in her fourth year in Orange County as the STEM Coordinator.

August Speaker, Lolly Busey, from Rikki's Refuge, a 450-acre, no-kill, all species peaceful sanctuary in Orange County supported solely by donations.
