Minutes from the August 27, 2020 BOD Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:07pm via Zoom on Thursday, August 27, 2020 by President, Jayne Owiesny. **SECRETARY'S REPORT**: The minutes of the July 23, 2020 BOD meeting, which were previously distributed were approved by Donalda Lovelace and seconded by Ann Wood.

#### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**: Jayne Owiesny

- Dinner Meeting: The next Lioness "dinner" meeting will be held on Thursday, September 10 at the Hollyfield Pavilion. The meeting will start at 5:30pm. ZOOM will not be available for this meeting. The LOW clubhouse will be providing boxed wrap or sandwiches. This is a BYOB if you would like to bring your favorite wine. Please make sure you bring your own cup. The meal cost is \$14.15. You MUST RSVP your menu selection to Ann Wood and/or Rani Manhard by Sunday, September 6. The Tamers must confirm your selections by September 9. Please see the menu selections in an article by Ann Wood and Rani Manhard in the LOWDOWN. We will only be accepting checks for payment, no cash. Please make sure that you are wearing a mask. If you do not feel safe sitting at one of the picnic tables in the pavilion, please bring a folding chair to sit on the outside of the pavilion.
- LOW Lioness Membership Handbooks. Jayne is doing her final review. We are anticipating that the new Lioness Member Handbook will be available at the September meeting.
- Wilderness Food Pantry: Nicki Buell notified the Lioness that they have had numerous large donations to the food pantry and that the Lioness could forgo their donation this year. The Lioness BOD voted that we would delete the Food Pantry Line Item from our 2020 Budget. Motion made by Claudia Low, seconded by Arlene Rich.
- Leadership conference: will be held the last weekend in Sept. Jayne and Donalda will be "attending" the leadership conference via Zoom. The cost is \$20.00. The District Governor's goal this year is for each chapter to visit 12 other Chapter meetings to see what other chapters are doing. We only need two Lioness to attend each visit to get credit for our club. Please contact Jayne to get additional information or to let her know that you will "attend" one of the meetings.
- School Supply Drive: we will continue to accept donations for school supplies. Please mail checks to Claudia Low, checks should be made payable to the Lioness Foundation. We are going to check with the schools at the beginning of 2021 to see if we can be of help.

- Ice Cream Social for Child Help: Jayne will be in touch with her contact at Child Help to see how things are going with the pandemic. It is our recommendation that we not send our entire team there, only a couple of people if we decide to go forward with the event. It was also decided that we would only provide bar desserts, not the normal sundaes. Jayne will keep us posted to see if we will go forward with the event.
- Lions Eye Institute Foundation Grant there is grant money available. We would like to contact the LOW Lions to see if they would like to join/co-sponsor a letter to the Locust Grove Schools to determine what types of needs there are in our community to help those students that are visually challenged. The money can be used for testing, equipment and scholarships. Details to follow.
- Halloween Family Scavenger Hunt: Plans are just forming. The committee met on Wednesday and the following are the plans they have so far:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> thing we must get in touch with LOW GM Phil Rodenberg to see if we have permission to have a Scavenger Hunt. Then we have to check with security to see what we have to do to keep everyone safe.
  - 2. Date: Saturday, October 31, 2:30pm 4:30pm, rain date, Sunday, November 1.
  - 3. The cost will be: \$10.00 per car.
  - 4. The scavenger hunt will start at: Hollyfield Pavilion and Sweetbriar Pavilion.
  - 5. The committee will develop a list of 15-20 clues where attendees can find goodies. Each team much collect at least 10 to qualify for one of three prizes. They would like to have Lioness be at each one of the collections points, dressed in costume to make sure that all goes well. We are also asking if your husbands would help at each collection point just to make sure that we don't have any trouble will potential teens stopping by.
  - 6. The committee will ask Lynne Travis prepare a flyer for the LOWDOWN, Lake Currents and Facebook. We will also need an article for all three means of communication.
  - 7. Goodie bags will be given to each of the children that participate.

#### Lioness Annual School Supply Drive Update

Hello Everyone,

First off I would like to thank the Lioness School Supply Drive Committee, Jayne Owiesny, Barbara Francis, Nan Lamb and Margaret Haight for all your help with the drive this year.

The school supply drive has been so different, but very successful this year. With so many different requirements, I started off by asking Jayne if I could contact the LOW Lions Club and the LOW AARP Chapter to see if they would help in providing a donation so that we could provide PPE Masks, hand sanitizer and disinfectant wipes for the schools. They both agreed and sent generous donations so that we could purchase those supplies. Secondly, we were blessed to receive a grant from Dave and Barbara Francis that we used to purchase needed mental health supplies, large easel pads so that they could write stories and then place them on the wall, Silly Putty, Fidget Hand Spinners, Second Step Puppy & Snail Puppets and Second Step Be-Calm Bunnies that the younger children may need to deal with the added stress. These items are ADHD compliant and were recommendations from the Orange County Curriculum Department. We received a list of needed supplies from the school for use in both the classroom and at home. No backpacks or frills this year, just the standard school supplies were requested. We also purchased several outfits for the younger children just in case of accidents in the classroom, i.e., sweatpants, t-shirts, sock and undies. We will also be making a donation to Orange Country Nutrition Department to be used at the Locust Grove Primary and Locust Grove Elementary school cafeterias to help offset the Cafeteria Balances. We wanted to make sure that all children receive a proper lunch.

Since this will be my last year as Chair of the School Supply Drive, I would like to thank everyone who has made a donation of school supplies or money, helped with the shopping, organizing the supplies around my dining room table, packing up the backpacks, loading my car and helping deliver our donations to the primary and elementary schools on behalf of the LOW Lioness. It has been an honor to have chaired this project and to have represented the LOW Lioness.

## Where are we with Holly's 10?

We have been in the training center for a month and a half. The dogs were glad to be back to work, earning treats, and playing together. Since early June, we have had two transfer camps and placed three dogs. With social distancing in place, we are holding multiple trainings rather than one or two larger trainings. The dogs did not lose too much ground after nearly four months away from the training center and picked up right where they left off. In fact, some gained a bit of maturity so that training has been progressing smoothly. This will allow quite a few placements before the group is two years old with several more soon after. We have been holding some "meet the dogs" sessions with clients since quite a few of these dogs are incredibly versatile and could do several different jobs. It is always beneficial if a dog and cli**ent** have a particular affinity for one another.



## Wylie

Wylie is a gentle, loving dog who is potentially matched to a child though she is a dog that could work for anyone. She is still learning her advanced cues as her trainer is new and is also learning. An easy dog to live with, she's not demanding, but is ready to go when called to action. Wylie is a "velcro dog" in that she forms a really strong bond with people and has great focus. She loves the cue "lap" where she rests her chin on your leg. She loves training and becomes frustrated when she has to wait for her turn. Her biggest challenge is ignoring good smells but she is working hard on that!
