Minutes from the July 28th 2022
BOD Meeting

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Judy Ludvigsen

- The minutes of the June 23, 2022 BOD meeting, which were previously distributed, were approved. Motion made by Susan Bergner and seconded by Darcy Jennings to approve the minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Diane Pittman

Administrative report - \$17764.43

Discussion was held on having a yearly audit of the books. Donalda felt we did not need a CPA to do this and we would need two people for this and neither could be Board Members.

Diane discussed the problem of collecting the cost of the dinner meeting (\$22) for those not notifying the Tamer (Heidi Brown) that they will not be attending the dinner meeting. It was decided that the Tamer would send the first letter to a Lioness who did not notify the Tamer and, if needed, the Treasurer would send a follow up letter if the \$22 was not paid by the following meeting.

PAST PRESIDENT: Kathy Merritt

Judy Ludvigsen (co-chair of this committee) asked if we could purchase additional supplies needed with cash collected if we kept receipts to verify our purchase. Board approved this request. Discussion was held on providing basic clothing for students and members also raised the idea of providing basic warm clothing items for the winter months.

- Loretta is having trouble obtaining credit card for our Lioness Club with Atlantic Union. It would be helpful to have this when purchasing White House Ornaments, etc. Getting a debit card was discussed as it is easier to obtain.
 Loretta will keep in touch with the bank regarding this card.

1ST **VICE PRESIDENT**: Barbara Tomayko and Arlene Rich reported that the Card Party ticket sales were moving right along with 28 for Bridge (Jan Lemieux) and 88 for other card games to date. Food to be served: Taco Bowl or Stuffed Tomato (vegetarian)

 2^{ND} VICE PRESIDENT: Gail Hardin was unable to attend tonight's meeting. Judy Ludvigsen spoke about the School Supplies Drive held in July. 
