Sally Day from Virginia Service Dogs gave us a wonderful presentation with service dog "Nonny". Nonny was trained from 8 weeks old to assist individuals with disabilities, diabetes, PTSD and other conditions that would benefit from these wonderful dogs. Sally demonstrated some of Nonny's skills including a peek a boo trick she had been taught by her original handler (an inmate of a correction facility!).

Service Dogs of Virginia is a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization that raises, trains, and places dogs to assist people with disabilities. Highly trained dogs perform a multitude of tasks that allow greater personal

freedom and independence. They serve clients residing in the Commonwealth of Virginia, and are based in Charlottesville, Virginia.

It costs approximately \$40,000 over a two-year period to raise, train, and place a successful service dog. Through the generous support of caring individuals, businesses, and foundations, Service Dogs of Virginia is able to provide service dogs at no cost to those in need.




