 Nicky reported that the Lions should be sending us \$2000 for our portion of the funds collected for the Golf Tournament.

A discussion was held regarding the three new members: Rosemary Butcher and Kathryn Phillips (sponsored by Billie Cooke) and Gayla Crow (sponsored by Lynne Kovach). The BOD voted unanimously to have them become new Lioness members. Their induction would be at the May dinner meeting.

The Slate of Officers for the coming year will be inducted at the June dinner meeting. Ellen Bearden Announced that there will be one Germanna scholarship in the amount of \$2000 awarded to Theresa Lewis. She is a single parent, has 3 dependents, and has 49 credits toward her degree, has an excellent GPA and will attend our dinner meeting to receive her award.

The BOD decided to name the scholarships the PAULA HORNADAY SCHOLARSHIP and to invite Paula's family to attend. We will also ask Millie Davis, who was a good friend of Paula's, to speak about Paula.

Orange County Planning Commission member Bryan Nicol gave the Lionesses an informative overview on the Germanna-Wilderness Area Plan (GWAP).

Some of Mr. Nicol's concerns about this plan are the proposed reduced access points on Route 3, proposed Data Centers, large distribution centers (i.e. Amazon), the impact on the LOW front gate, traffic and water for existing residents. Mr. Nicol encouraged us to learn as much as we could about the plans, to write to our supervisor and to attend the April 25th Orange County Board of Supervisor's meeting to voice our opinions.

Update: In spite of overwhelming community opposition, the Board of Supervisors voted 4-1 to approve the rezoning request for the GWAP.


