NEXTREX RECYCLING CHALLENGE PROGRAM

GOOD NEWS: Our 2024 Lioness Recycling Project with TREX is nearly complete!

GOOD NEWS: When our December recycling push resulted in a volume overage that couldn't be disposed of locally and plastic was piling up on Anne LeHuray's porch and in her home, an angel appeared in the form of Ben White from LOW Lions Club. He packed the whole load into his pickup truck and took it to the Fauquier County Large Volume Recycling Facility in Warrenton.

GOOD NEWS: After that plastic was weighed and recorded, **we have less than 50** pounds left to collect!

GOOD **NEWS:** We can meet our new deadline of March 1st!

GOOD NEWS: When we complete the project, we will have a beautiful and valuable TREX bench made completely of recycled plastic, which we can sell or donate.

THE BEST NEWS: We will have kept 1,000 pounds of hard-to-recycle plastic out of landfills! And we can do it all again next year.
