### Plastic Recycling

#### Don't Forget to Recycle Plastic Bags!

By now, you've all seen the beautiful bench on Clubhouse Point, donated by our Lioness club. To earn this bench, our club collected 1,000 pounds of lightweight, hard-to-recycle plastic bags, film, and packing products and recycled them with NexTrex. Trex turns this plastic into beautiful, durable outdoor furniture and decks.

We're currently working toward a second bench, which we can donate or sell as a fundraiser.


We're on our way to collecting another 1,000 pounds by the end of December. Trex accepts all lightweight plastic bags, including newspaper sleeves, bread bags, zip lock bags, dry cleaning bags, film from plastic containers, the plastic binding around water bottles, or any other plastic marked with recycling numbers 2 or 4 or the words: Recycle by Store Drop-off. All donated plastic must be clean, dry, and free of paper labels.

**PLEASE** keep saving these lightweight plastic items. It's easy! Hang a big bag in your closet or garage and add these items whenever you get them. When your bag is full, drop it off at one of our convenient collection bins:

- Anne LeHuray at 319 Liberty Blvd.
- Darcy Jennings at 419 Wilderness Dr.
- Nan Lamb at 1439 Lakeview Parkway (near the back gate)

No need to call ahead.

Let's keep another 1,000 pounds of plastic out of the environment and benefit our community at the same time!

### My First International Lions Convention

Fellow Lioness Lions,

I became a Lioness on November 11, 2022. Since then, I've attended a handful of local events/conferences. Learning more about this organization being international piqued my interest in trying to grasp and understand the international scale. I thought, maybe one day, I could attend a Lions International Convention. I thought attending such a conference on a global level would allow me to give our club exposure while experiencing firsthand the international element. I thought it would help me personally understand the breadth and scope of service on an international scale. As luck would have it, the **107<sup>th</sup> International Convention**, originally scheduled in Mexico City, was relocated much closer to home: Orlando, FL. **So I registered!**

I arrived in Orlando just in time for dinner. Although I missed the "Parade of Nations" earlier that day, when entering the hotel's restaurant, I was delighted at what awaited me. I saw a sea of diversity, culture, languages and such vibrant colors in dress attire represented by many nations. This was just a small preview of what I would experience the next morning at the convention center.

I was now experiencing all the wonderful things I had looked forward to, and so much more. I saw that we were brought together by a common goal: to serve people around the world. I saw that amongst the diversity of members, we all shared the same commitment to service and were inspired to serve ALL walks of life. Being at this convention helped me understand how our singular LOW Lioness Lions Club is not an isolated group, but an integral and important part of the fabric which makes up the Lions International.

It seemed like many of the clubs represented had several members in attendance, and I, as the only one representing our club, felt a little nervous and intimidated in general. More so when I walked into the formal Banquet Dinner. Despite my hesitation, I walked in, and sat at a random table. They had just started to introduce themselves and say what position they each held within their club and on an international level. After hearing their introductions and realizing that I was dining with upper levels of this organization, I introduced myself as Secretary of the LOW Lioness Lions Club, and questioned out loud, "What am I even doing here?" Without hesitation, someone responded "Because you belong here. Because you are part of this global organization. Because that's how we all started. Because that's how we all got here."

My overall experience was wonderful and absolutely worth the trip, although it would have been just as rewarding had I traveled to Mexico City. **The highlight of my experiences was listening to, meeting, and taking a picture with 2024-2025 Lions International President, Fabricio Oliveira (no relation) from Brazil.**

I would recommend my fellow Lioness Lions to attend an international conference, should the opportunity present itself. I understand that, as these conferences are staged around the world, it could present obstacles for many to attend. As luck would have it, the **109<sup>th</sup> Lions International Convention** will be held in our own backyard: Washington, DC.




